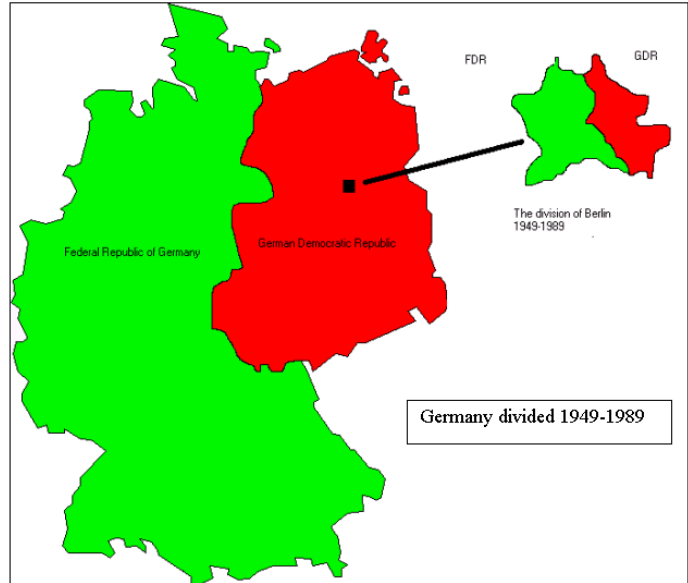


## Cold War – 2
