

Look at page 258 (Our World Today), Rivalry Between Nations. How did the Industrial Revolution create rivalries between the European countries?




European countries needed more resources to make things for the Industrial Revolution.

So they traveled to Africa and Asia for these items.




The European nations took over African and Asian territories to use them for their land/ resources.

Were the Africans/ Asians ok with this? (Think back to our story of the banker and the farmer).



Imperialism - system of building foreign empires for military and trade advantages



Under imperialism, one country was taken over by another.

Activity: Split up the land amongst yourselves.

You and a group of other students will be given a piece of land (a piece of paper).

This land is very valuable - the more of it you own, the more money you get.

Split the land up amongst yourselves by drawing your territories on the paper. The student with the most territory will earn a special prize.

Do you think when European countries were splitting up land that they argued in the process?





Using this information we just discussed... what do you think happened in Europe between the European countries?
