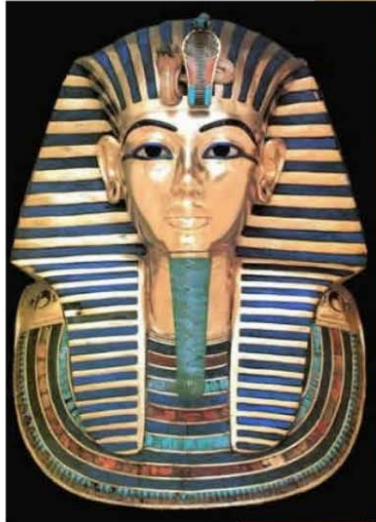

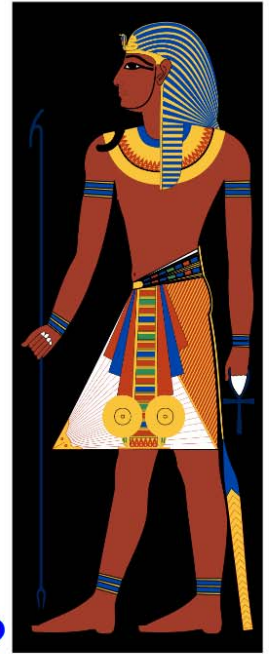

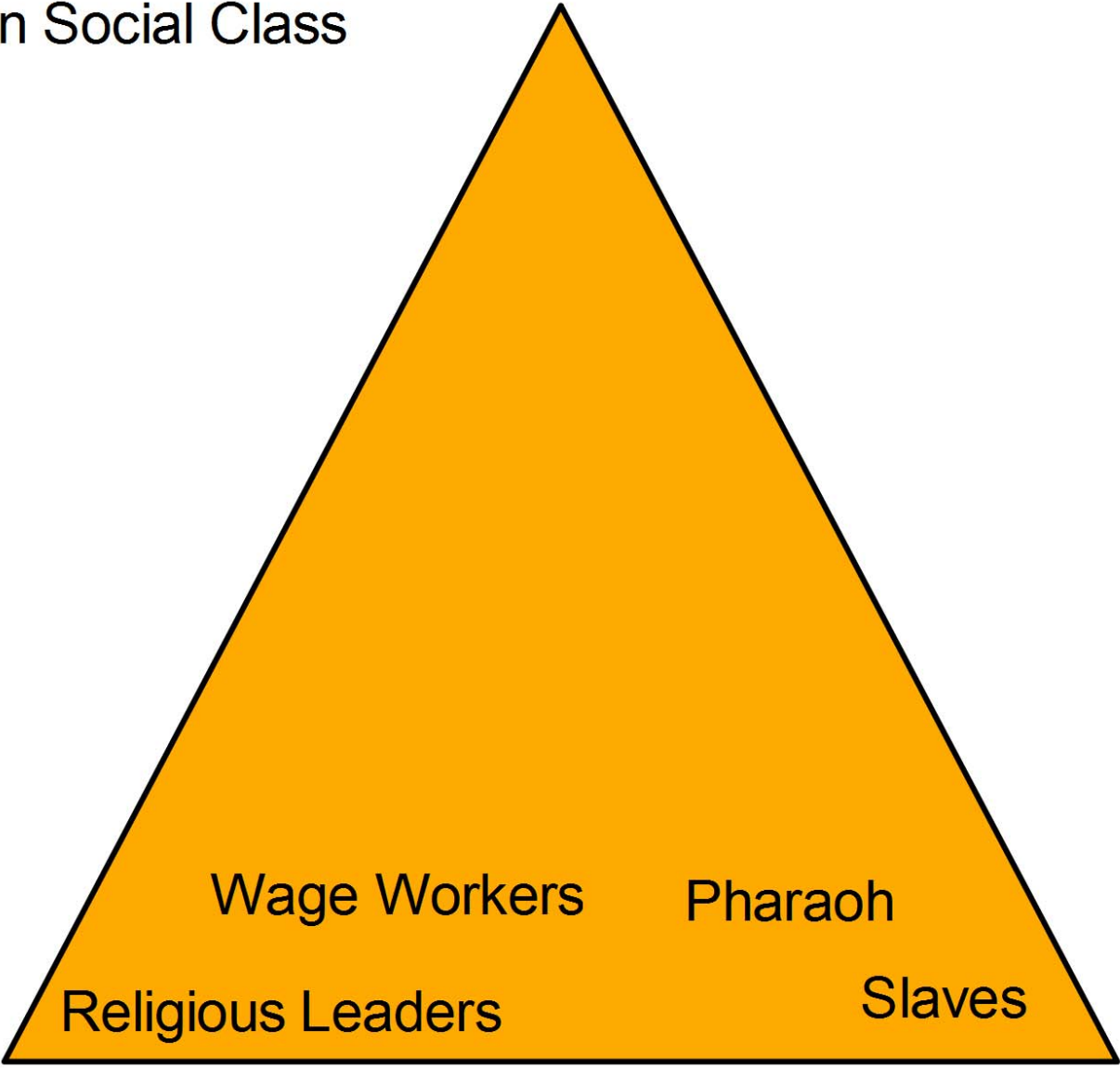

Egyptian Social Class



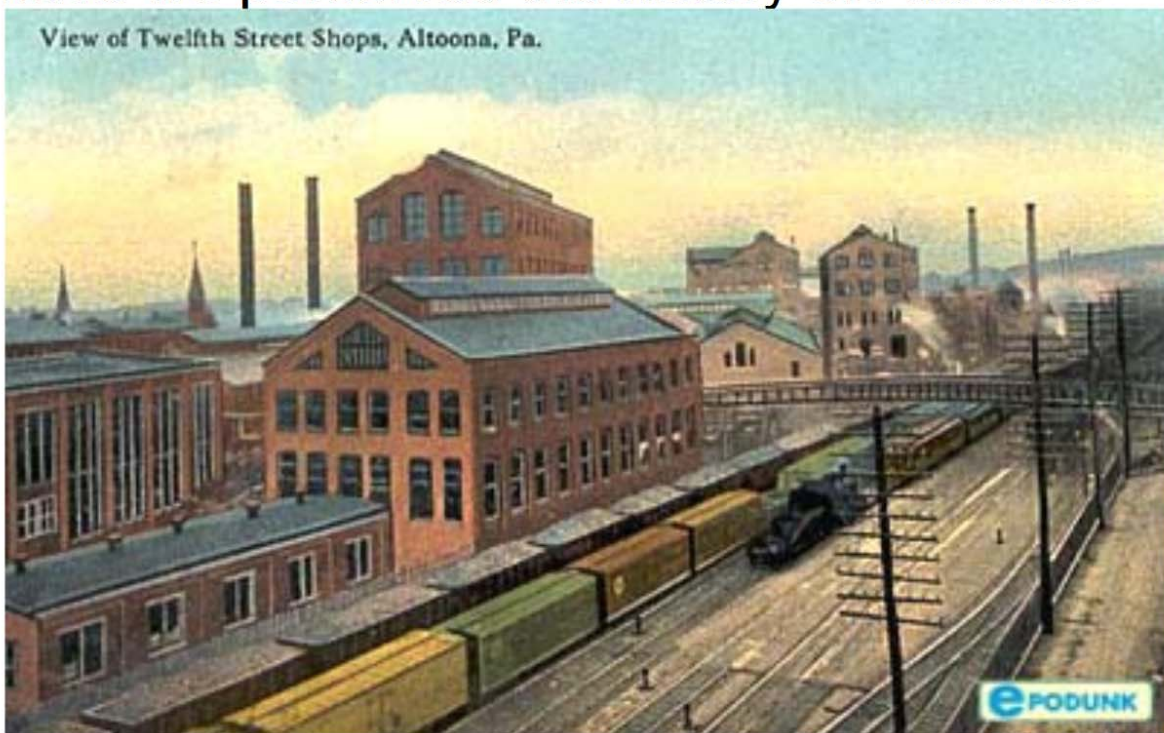

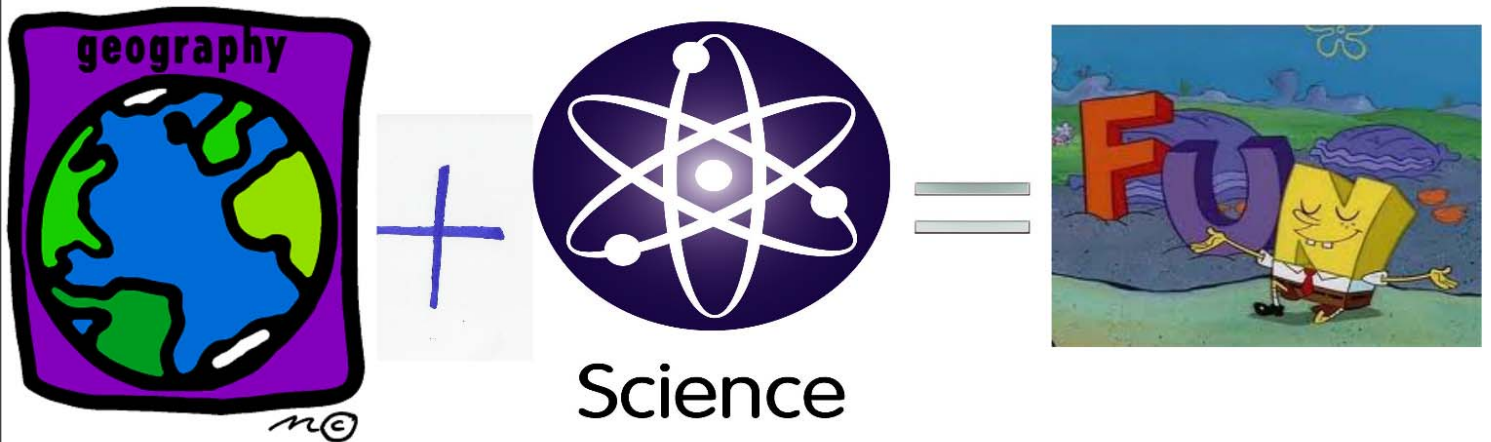




Lets take a look at a real mummy and how it was made...
