


Parts of a Map...

What is missing from the previous map?




Parts of a Map

1. **Title** - tells the reader what is on the map
2. **Legend (Key)** - Interprets the colors and symbols and what they represent.
3. **Grid System** - lines used to find absolute location.
4. **Compass Rose** - shows direction
Cardinal Directions - N,S,E,W
Intermediate Directions - In between
5. **Scale** - shows the relationship between a unit of measure on a map and a unit of measure on the earth.




Map Information

General Reference Maps

Gives the reader such information as location, size, and distance.

political: countries borders, states, and cities



physical: elevation




Thematic Maps

Gives the reader more specific information, often on a single topic. They show the distribution or amount of something in a certain area.

ex. A. Population Distribution

B. Land Use and Resources

C. Climate and Vegetation
